Students will explore various musical styles and develop the ability to perform confidently in solo and ensemble settings. Additionally, the integration of **Korean language education** in the first two terms provides students with a unique opportunity to connect with the Korean music industry, broadening their cultural and professional horizons.

This program is designed to equip students with the technical proficiency, creative skills, and performance experience necessary to pursue careers as professional musicians. Whether students aim to continue their musical education, perform on the global stage, or enter the music industry, this program offers a robust foundation to achieve their ambitions. The ultimate goal is to foster a new generation of skilled pianists in Rwanda who can contribute to the country's cultural growth and international presence in the arts.

The curriculum is structured into three key sections:

- 1. **Comprehensive Piano Training**: The curriculum offers a solid foundation in **piano techniques**, from beginner to advanced levels, enhancing students' technical proficiency, stage presence, and artistic expression.
- 2. Integration of Music Theory and Composition: Students receive in-depth instruction in music theory, aural skills, and composition, ensuring a well-rounded understanding of music that supports their performance skills.

3. Korean Language and International Connection: The inclusion of Korean language education in the first two terms allows students to develop skills that can facilitate engagement with the Korean music industry, opening up international career opportunities.

By the end of the program, students will have the technical, creative, and professional skills to pursue diverse opportunities in music performance, teaching, and industry-related fields, both locally and globally.

2.4 Minimum entry requirements


The minimum entry requirement to this program is to be physically and mentally fit with an interest in Piano Performance and related area.

- Educational Background:
 - Completion of secondary education (O-Level or A-Level) or an equivalent qualification.
- Musical Experience:
 - Basic knowledge of piano playing (ability to read music and perform simple pieces).
 - Prior experience in music theory and sight-reading is recommended but not mandatory.
- Language Proficiency:
 - Basic proficiency in English (as it will be the primary language of instruction).
- Passion and Commitment:
 - Demonstrated interest in piano performance and a willingness to pursue a career in music.
 - Motivation and discipline to complete an intensive, one-year program.

These entry requirements ensure that students have the foundational skills and commitment necessary to succeed in the program.


